## Light shed on sightings

THE recent musings in this column about orange lights spotted over Narrabeen Lake on October 6 prompted a response from Attila Kaldy of the UFO Society.

Attila, who has conducted aerial phenomenon research in the northern beaches for nearly two years, yesterday recalled a similar light show involving "2-3 unidentified anomalies" on June 26. He said on that occasion orange balls of light ("Orange Light Phenomenon") would individually appear from the open sea just above the water and head inland at substantial speed. He said they would then stop and hover offshore before submerging into the sea.

"These sightings were not just witnessed by one or two people, and I can assure the readers that no alcohol was consumed before or after the sightings."

Attila admitted at least 20 per cent of sightings reported are explainable.

"But what of the remaining 20 per cent and the ones who are reluctant to come forward?" he said.

"It would be an element

of simplicity to shrug it off with some ridiculous, common explanation like a planet, shooting star or fireworks. But people are not silly. Planets don't take off, shooting stars don't come to a sudden halt and think, and I am yet to see intelligently controlled fireworks.

"If all genuine explanations are ruled out, we should stop and think outside the square we live in. "And I think that these people who come forth with their experiences should get a little more credit . . .

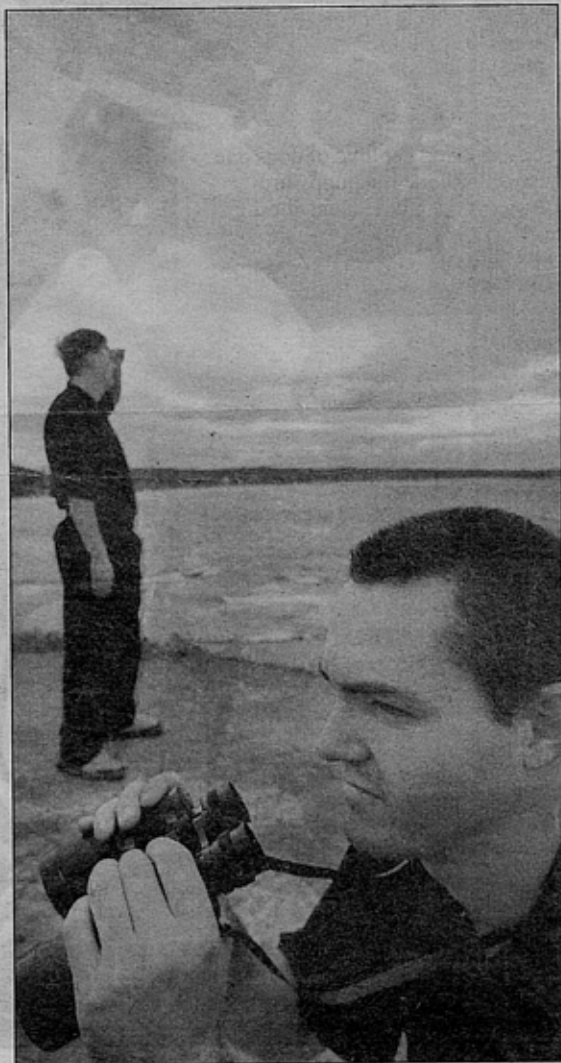
"For those out there who think nothing of what I have just said, remember, it can happen to anyone."
